Whānau hui is for everyone regardless whether we are Māori or not and we are open and excited to have new whānau come on board.

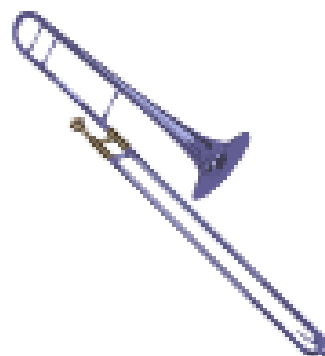
